### MONTHLY UPDATE:

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS SHOT AND KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY





The National Fraternal Order of Police reports that as of midnight on 31 August, there have been 220 officers shot so far in 2021, 40 of whom were killed by gunfire. There have been 67 ambush-style attacks on law enforcement officers this year (+148% from 2020 YTD), which have resulted in 83 officers shot, 20 of whom were killed. The number of ambush-style attacks on law enforcement does not account for the number of attacks that resulted in no officers being shot.

## **BACKGROUND**

The Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) within the U.S. Department of Justice recently published the 2020 Year-End Law Enforcement Officers Shot in the Line of Duty, which contains the research conducted by staff with the National FOP's Government and Media Affairs Center (GMAC).

In October of 2019, the National Fraternal Order of Police partnered with the National Blue Alert Network to collect and analyze data on reported shootings of law enforcement officers nationwide. Using media monitoring software and general research, staff with the National FOP's Government and Media Affairs Center (GMAC) has tracked, collected, and analyzed publicly available information to produce the 2020 Year-End Summary on officers shot and killed in the line of duty.

The report contains data on law enforcement officers shot in the line of duty, both fatally and non-fatally, for the expressed purpose of better understanding the nature and frequency of incidents that could give rise to the issuance of a **Blue Alert**.

These are preliminary numbers and are subject to change. The final report will be published in early 2022.

## **NATURE OF ATTACKS**

Every felonious attack on a law enforcement officer, especially by gunfire, is disturbing regardless of the circumstances. Officers are always vulnerable to life-threatening attacks and therefore must always be vigilant and maintain the highest level of situational awareness. In most cases, officers are able to quickly assess situations, recognize threats, and take adequate defensive actions. Tragically, not every threat can be seen or mitigated. Perhaps most troubling and worrisome are ambush-style and other calculated attacks on law enforcement.

Premeditated ambush-style attacks are particularly disturbing and pernicious. These types of attacks are carried out with an element of surprise and intended to deprive officers of the ability to defend against the attack. Premeditated attacks contribute to a worrisome desensitization to evil acts that were once largely considered taboo except by the most depraved. In 2020, 49% of shooting incidents involved a discernible element of premeditation, which is a 7% increase over 2019.

# **AMBUSH-STYLE ATTACK**

An ambush-style attack is defined as when an officer is shot without any warning or opportunity to defend themselves.

### **NOTES**

- On 11 March 2021, Deputy Sheriff Allen Burdic with the Douglas
   County Sheriff's Office (OR) died as the result of complications of
   gunshot wounds sustained on 12 August 1980, while responding to a
   shooting in Myrtle Creek.
- On 15 March 2021, Police Officer Kevin Valencia with the Orlando Police Department (FL) succumbed to complications of gunshot wounds sustained on 11 June 2018, while responding to a domestic disturbance.
- On 23 May 2021, Detective Stephen Arnold with the Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office (LA) succumbed to gunshot wounds sustained on 26 January 2016, while serving a search warrant and arrest warrant.
- On 3 August 2021, Police Officer George Gonzalez with the Pentagon Force Protection Agency was killed in an unprovoked attack at the Pentagon's Transit Center in Arlington, Virginia. Various media reports, including from ABC News and Washington Post, state that the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) confirmed that the suspect not only stabbed Officer Gonzalez, but also shot him with his own service weapon.
